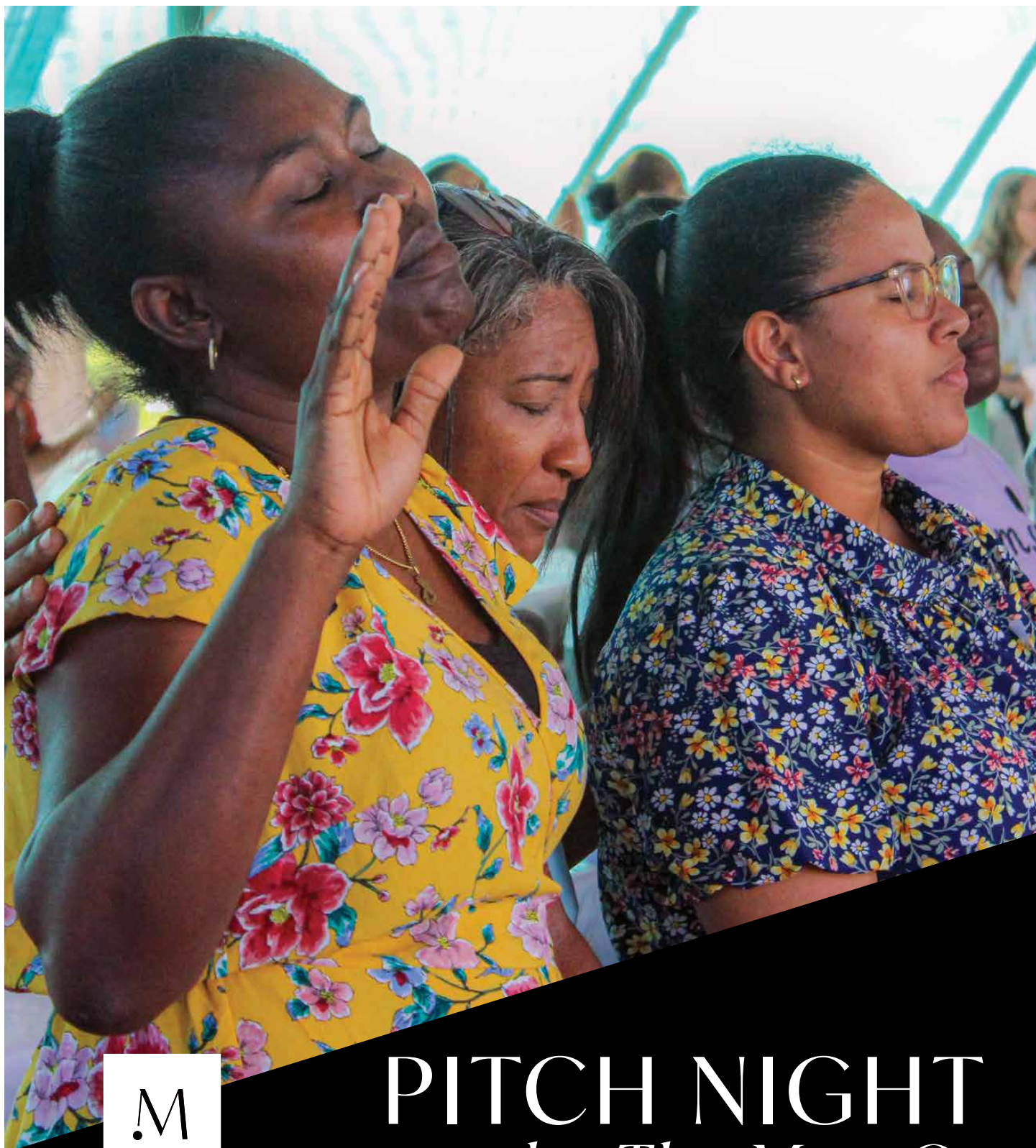

Each project is unique, yet together they tell one beautiful story: **God is using mothers to transform families, strengthen churches, and bring hope to communities around the world.**

NEURODIVERGENT FAMILIES



ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through Come As You Are, sensory inclusive resources are helping create more welcoming church and school environments where families raising neurodivergent children can participate more fully in worship and community. The project equipped four churches and schools with sensory supports, distributed a devotional to 250 mothers, and expanded access to resources now reaching more than 1,000 families and individuals through participating churches, schools, and ongoing ministry.

As neighboring churches witnessed the impact, additional congregations began requesting the resources, creating new opportunities for the ministry to grow. In the coming year, MomCo will also translate Come As You Are resources into six additional languages, making them available to MomCo groups around the world.

By removing barriers and equipping churches to welcome every child, Come As You Are is creating a lasting ripple effect, helping more children and families experience belonging, community, and the love of Christ together.

IMPACT:

- **250 moms** received the *Come As You Are* devotional.
- **4 churches and schools** were equipped with sensory-inclusive resources.
- **1,000+ families and individuals** now have ongoing access to sensory supports through participating churches and schools.

01. SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS

Many faith communities and parochial schools are not equipped to support neurodivergent children and their families. Parents often feel isolated, misunderstood, and heartbroken as they search for spaces where their children are welcomed, and their unique needs are met with compassion.

The Come As You Are initiative, led by a MomCo leader with firsthand experience, seeks to change that. This project aims to partner with churches and parochial schools to build environments where every child is embraced as a gift from God.

With MomCo's support, this initiative will launch neurodiversity trainings for educators, volunteers, and church staff. It will create sensory-friendly spaces in both schools and churches and develop resource kits that foster understanding and inclusion. The goal is to equip faith communities to love and support neurodivergent children and their families with grace, not judgment.

This project is rooted in the belief that no mom should have to choose between her child and her faith community, and no child should feel like a disruption in the house of God. Through practical tools and a spirit of welcome, this work will open doors for families who have long felt left out.

HOPE FOR MOMS

02. SOUTH ASIA

In the slums of South Asia, more than 1.5 million people live in overcrowded conditions with limited access to clean water, sanitation, and healthcare. Pregnant and nursing mothers are especially vulnerable, often facing malnutrition, long working hours, and little to no support. Many are domestic workers or laborers, balancing survival with the demands of motherhood. Their children are frequently left unattended and exposed to unsafe environments.

MomCo is already present in the heart of this reality, serving 30 moms from the slums. The Hope for Moms project will build on that foundation to reach 500 more women with tangible support and spiritual care. With the help of current MomCo members, the project will form 20 new groups of 25 moms each, creating safe spaces for community, discipleship, and growth.

Moms will receive counseling, skills training, childcare support, and self-care resources to help them identify their strengths and gain confidence. The MomCo Global Curriculum will guide their spiritual journey, encouraging women to love God with their whole heart, mind, and body. Emotional health will be addressed using the Global Mental Health Curriculum, and leaders will share personal testimonies to stir faith and offer hope. Moms who choose to follow Jesus will be connected with local churches, and their children will be ministered to through the KidsCo program.

The project will culminate in a celebration for the moms and their children. With a sustainable, peer-led model and support from community partners, this work will continue long after the initial grant, offering ongoing hope and transformation for mothers living in the world's most vulnerable communities.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

In the crowded communities of South Asia, where many mothers face poverty, isolation, and uncertainty, Hope for Moms created places of refuge where women could experience authentic community and hope. Through 10 MomCo groups meeting alongside local churches, mothers from a variety of faith backgrounds gathered each month to build relationships, receive practical support, and experience God's love in tangible ways.

Throughout the year, more than 500 mothers received food, hygiene supplies, medical kits, and practical training in literacy, healthy cooking, sewing, and basic first aid, equipping women with skills and resources to strengthen their families. As mothers studied Scripture, shared their stories, and prayed together, lives began to change. One mother found renewed hope as her son emerged from a season of despair and began attending church, while another saw her prayers for her husband's healing answered, ultimately connecting their entire family to a local church.

Today, all 10 MomCo groups continue to meet, creating lasting opportunities for mothers to grow in faith, invite other women into community, and connect with local churches. What began as one Pitch Night idea has become a thriving ministry reaching families throughout South Asia, reminding mothers that they are seen, supported, and deeply loved by God.

IMPACT:

- **500+ moms** were reached through ongoing MomCo groups, with 100 previously unbelieving moms now regularly attending church.
- **1,000 children** have been impacted, including **400** now attending Sunday school.
- **10 MomCo groups** are continuing to serve mothers across South Asia.
- **90% of participating moms** came from different faith backgrounds, creating new opportunities to share the gospel.

MATERNIDAD ACERCA MOVIMIENTO ACUERDO
(MATERNITY BRINGS MOVEMENT CLOSER TO AGREEMENT)



Through these relationships, moms will discover that despite language, culture, or circumstance, they share the same calling. This project aims to lift the banner of love and unity within the body of Christ and show that motherhood is a bond strong enough to bridge even the deepest divides.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Project M.A.M.A. created safe, Christ-centered spaces where expectant and new mothers could experience practical support, authentic community, and the hope of Jesus during one of the most vulnerable seasons of motherhood. Through baby showers, family celebrations, leadership development, and MomCo gatherings, mothers received essential resources while building meaningful relationships with other women and local churches. The project also intentionally brought Dominican and Haitian mothers together, creating opportunities for unity, encouragement, and gospel-centered friendships across cultural barriers.

As the ministry grew, three new MomCo groups were launched and existing groups were strengthened, extending Christ-centered community to even more mothers and

families. New Creole devotionals and translated MomCo resources were also developed, creating tools to reach Haitian mothers well beyond the grant year and laying the foundation for continued growth throughout the region.

The impact of Project M.A.M.A. extends far beyond the resources provided. Each mother who experiences the love of Christ has the opportunity to strengthen her family, influence her community, and carry that hope forward to the next generation.

IMPACT:

- **516 moms** and women were served through the project.
- **298 children** were impacted.
- **3 new MomCo groups** launched.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

In the Dominican Republic, thousands of Haitians are being deported each day. Among them are mothers, some just days postpartum, crossing into unfamiliar territory with infants in their arms and no support system in place. One such woman was a MomCo leader, forced to leave her home shortly after giving birth. Her story represents the harsh reality many Haitian mothers face.

Amid this crisis, Dominican MomCo leaders are seeking to break down cultural barriers and extend love and solidarity to their Haitian sisters. The M.A.M.A. program was created to foster unity and healing between Dominican and Haitian moms through the shared experience of motherhood.

This project will begin with leaders from both communities, pairing Haitian and Dominican MomCo groups to support expectant mothers. Together they will host joint gatherings, organize baby showers, and provide resources translated into Creole to ensure Haitian mothers feel seen, included, and cared for.

MIAHY MEANS CARE

04. MADAGASCAR

In Madagascar, nearly one-third of girls become mothers between the ages of 15 and 19, often due to unplanned pregnancy and a lack of education. Once pregnant, these young women are excluded from the national scholarship system and face significant barriers to continuing their studies, finding employment, or being accepted into marriage. Many rely on handouts to survive and suffer from mental health challenges rooted in shame, isolation, and poverty.

Located in one of the most remote regions of southern Madagascar, MomCo Farafangana serves 50 local moms, 80% of whom became mothers as teenagers. The MIAHY project seeks to reach them, along with 100 additional young mothers in a nearby community, with support that is both practical and deeply transformative.

The initiative will offer counseling, skills training, and creative activities that help each woman identify and develop her gifts, paving a path toward emotional healing and financial independence. To care for their spiritual needs, the MomCo leaders will present a drama based on the story in 1 Kings 3 that explores wisdom and dignity in motherhood. The project will culminate with a celebration day for the moms and their children.

By investing in these young women, MomCo and MIAHY are helping to restore the women's sense of worth, build a foundation for a better future, and invite them into renewed hope in Christ.



ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through MIAHY, 300 teen mothers found hope, practical support, and a Christ-centered community that reminded them of their value and purpose in Jesus. Across three regions of Madagascar, mothers received Bibles, mental health support, life skills training, and opportunities to develop income-generating skills, while 500 children also benefited through family support and outreach. As mothers discovered their God-given gifts and gained new skills, many began strengthening their families, serving their communities, and stepping into leadership.

The impact of MIAHY continues to multiply beyond the original project. Thirteen new leaders and seven new MomCo groups were established through partnerships with 11 church denominations, creating a growing network of support and opening the door for even greater gospel impact across Madagascar. An unexpected impact of this project was significant expansion into a nearby village. After the pastor of a well-known church heard about the impact MomCo was having in the region, 87 additional MomCo groups were launched. This growth helped push MomCo Africa beyond the milestone of 1,000 groups.

As mothers encounter the hope of Christ and are equipped to lead, the impact reaches far beyond one woman. Families grow stronger, churches gain new leaders, and communities are transformed as moms carry that hope forward.

IMPACT:

- **300 teen moms** were served through the project.
- **500 children** were impacted.
- **13 new leaders** experienced development.
- **94 new MomCo groups** launched.

PORTLAND NEEDS GOD

05. PORTLAND, OREGON

In Portland, Oregon, raising a family can feel like swimming upstream. Public drug use, spiritual apathy, and anti-family messaging are part of the daily landscape. Churches struggle to grow, and families often feel isolated in their desire to follow Jesus and raise children with purpose. In addition, no church in Portland proper has a MomCo ministry.

Yet Portland is also a place of striking beauty, creativity, and opportunity. Nestled between rivers and mountains, it is a city alive with possibility. And in the midst of its challenges, God is stirring something new.

Portland Needs God exists to encourage and equip the families who are choosing to stay and stand firm in their faith. Through launching several MomCo groups for connection, discipleship, and community, this project will unite Christian moms who are raising children in one of the most spiritually challenging places in the country.

By building intentional relationships and strengthening their faith, these moms will become a source of light and hope in a city that desperately needs both.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

In one of the least church-ed cities in the United States, 65 mothers and 45 children found authentic Christian community through Portland MomCo. Women representing more than 20 churches gathered to encourage one another, grow in faith, and welcome moms from every background, including those with no relationship with Jesus and those who had experienced church hurt, into a community where they could encounter the hope of Christ.

As relationships deepened, lives began to change. One woman made a first-time decision to follow Jesus, and two people were baptized, while mothers formed meaningful friendships that extended far beyond monthly gatherings. By bringing women and churches together around a shared mission, Portland MomCo created a stronger network of Christ-centered community for families across the city.

In a place where many mothers may never walk through the doors of a church on their own, Portland MomCo is creating a place to belong, building bridges back to the Church, and helping more families discover the hope of Jesus.

IMPACT:

- **65 moms** experienced MomCo community for the first time in Portland.
- **45 children** were impacted.
- **1 decision** was made for Christ.
- **2 people** proclaimed their faith through baptism.



SUPPORTING OUR LOCAL MATERNITY WARD

06.
LUSAKA, ZAMBIA

In the rural outskirts of Lusaka, Zambia, the local maternity ward is overcrowded and under-resourced. Women often arrive in active labor, carrying their own water and birthing materials, and share beds due to a shortage of space, staff, and supplies. While it is safer than giving birth at home, the conditions remain far from adequate.

Since 2017, MomCo Zambia has partnered with this ward, offering practical help and spiritual care. What began as a shared service project among local MomCo groups has led to tangible improvements in maternal and neonatal health, as well as stronger community support. Over the years, volunteers have returned regularly, delivering washable pads, test kits, cleaning supplies, and prayerful encouragement to the women giving birth.

Now, with 60 MomCo groups across the country, the Supporting Our Local Maternity Ward initiative is proposing a two-part project to deepen their impact. First, they will provide the maternity ward with essential medical equipment, including delivery beds and heart rate monitors, to improve care for mothers and babies. Second, they will assemble 500 care packages filled with Bible verses, MomCo information, and encouraging materials to minister to each new mother. Posters with uplifting messages and invitations to join MomCo will also be displayed throughout the ward.

This project aims not only to meet urgent physical needs but also to invite more women into the hope and community of MomCo, supporting the continued growth of the movement in Zambia.



ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through Supporting Our Local Maternity Ward, thousands of mothers and babies at Chipata Level One Hospital have benefited from medical equipment that helps staff identify complications earlier, monitor high-risk pregnancies, improve maternal and infant care, and operate a second maternity theater for emergencies. With approximately 900 maternity admissions each month, the project's impact continues to grow well beyond MomCo's initial investment. During three hospital visits, MomCo leaders personally reached 180 mothers with prayer and the gospel and provided approximately 250 care bags with newborn essentials, with another 250 planned. Nine mothers expressed interest in staying connected, leading to the launch of a new MomCo group. Through continued quarterly visits, care bag distribution, and an ongoing presence in the maternity ward, this partnership is strengthening medical care while creating lasting pathways for mothers to experience the hope of Jesus and find community through MomCo.

IMPACT:

- **Thousands of mothers and babies** have benefited from improved maternity care, with approximately 900 maternity admissions each month.
- **180 moms** were personally reached with prayer and the gospel during three MomCo hospital visits.
- **Approximately 250 care bags** have been distributed or provided to the hospital, with 250 more planned.
- **9 new MomCo connections** were made, leading to 1 new MomCo group.
- **A second maternity operating theater** was equipped and opened for emergency care.

MUMCO ON THE ROAD

\$8,000 WINNER

AUSTRALIA

07.

A 10-day outreach trip bringing the MumCo experience to five Australian regions to support local mums, share the hope of Jesus, and inspire churches to start their own MumCo Meetups.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

When Australian moms could not find a MumCo group nearby, MumCo on the Road brought community directly to them. Traveling across three states, the project reached 71 mothers and 35 children through gatherings hosted alongside local churches, creating spaces for connection while helping church leaders envision new ways to reach families in their communities.

The launch of MumCo in a Box also equipped churches with resources to continue welcoming and gathering moms beyond the road trip, helping more mothers discover they do not have to navigate motherhood alone.

MOMCO BUS

08.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

To make the most of their Pitch Night grant, MomCo leaders purchased a bus in Togo that will provide transportation for mothers throughout communities in Ghana. The team is currently awaiting the bus' release and transfer to Ghana, where it will help remove transportation barriers and make it easier for more moms to participate in MomCo gatherings and experience Christ-centered community.

GHANA

Transports over 1,500 moms to MomCo conferences, expanding MomCo's reach from nine to all sixteen regions in Ghana.

LOVED, SEEN, INCLUDED

09.

BRAZIL

Equips 10 Brazilian churches to support moms of children with disabilities through training, resources, and MomCo groups, fostering inclusive communities where mothers feel seen, cared for, and connected to Jesus.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through Loved, Seen, Included, more than 300 mothers and church leaders were equipped to create more welcoming and inclusive communities for families raising children with disabilities and special needs. Three new MomCo groups were launched, providing ongoing encouragement and connection for mothers who often experience isolation.

Churches across Brazil are continuing to grow in their ability to welcome and support every child and family, creating communities where families are seen, valued, and reminded of God's love.

CLEAN HOPE

10.

CENTRAL ASIA

Equips mothers with an affordable, faith-centered laundromat: a safe place to wash clothes, rest, and connect through MomCo events while having the opportunity to work and gain a community.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Renovations are underway to transform a community space into a laundry facility and gathering place in an area where safe spaces and employment opportunities are limited. The rooms have been cleared and painting is complete, preparing the space for the installation of laundry equipment.

Once renovations are finished, the facility will provide practical support for local families while creating a welcoming place to launch new MomCo groups and build lasting community among mothers.

HOPE THROUGH MOTHERS

BREAKING CHAINS OF ADDICTION WITH MOMCO

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Project leaders walked alongside more than 100 mothers impacted by addiction, offering consistent support, meaningful connection, and a community of women who understand the challenges of recovery and motherhood. Through intentional relationships and ongoing encouragement, the project helped mothers find hope, build stability, and experience the power of being known and supported during some of life's most difficult seasons.

11.

SOUTH ASIA

Supports mothers affected by family addiction through Christ-centered healing, counseling, and community, helping them find hope, purpose, and faith in Jesus.



HIGH-EFFICIENCY STOVES & NEW MOMCO GROUPS FOR EASTERN UGANDA

12.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through this project, more than 545 mothers are spending less time gathering firewood and cooking, giving them more time to care for their families, build meaningful relationships, and participate in local MomCo groups.

By partnering with 10 new churches, the project is creating lasting communities where practical support opens the door to connection and spiritual growth.

EASTERN UGANDA

Distributes 1,024 efficient, safe cooking stoves to mothers in Eastern Uganda, reducing fuel use, smoke, and daily hardship, while launching 20 new MomCo groups to provide practical, emotional, and spiritual support.

HOPE FOR HER

UGANDA

13.

A cervical cancer awareness and screening initiative providing 600 women with education, free testing, and faith-based care, empowering them to take control of their health while connecting them to MomCo community support.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through Hope for Her, 1,427 women and children across two districts in Uganda received essential healthcare, health education, and spiritual encouragement. More than 736 women received cervical cancer education, screenings, maternal care, and referrals, while 691 children received immunizations and deworming support.

The project also strengthened community trust and connected more mothers to ongoing Christ-centered community, helping launch 10 new MomCo groups where women can continue to find support, belonging, and the hope of Jesus.

THE LIGHT PROJECT

MINNESOTA

14.

An outreach that brings hope to local mothers through Hope Boxes, Haven Helpers, and Grace Grams, which offer tangible support, encouragement, and reminders of God's love to those who feel unseen or alone.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through The Light Project, 150 parents and 63 children were encouraged through Hope Boxes that provided practical care and a tangible reminder of God's love during difficult seasons. Christmas and Easter celebrations also welcomed dozens of additional families into Christ-centered community where they could experience connection and the hope of Jesus.

Through simple acts of kindness and intentional relationships, The Light Project is helping families feel seen, supported, and reminded that Christ's light can reach even the darkest seasons.



BAKING MOMS COLLECTIVE

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

With support from MomCo, a mother in Central Asia transformed her vision for a community bakery into a place of opportunity, connection, and hope. Through the project, 50 mothers received baking and business skills training, equipping them to earn income from home while continuing to care for their children.

The bakery continues to provide a supportive space where women can build confidence, develop practical skills, pursue new opportunities, and experience a community that reflects the love of Jesus.

15. CENTRAL ASIA

Empowers 60 vulnerable mothers through baking training, mentorship, and faith-based support, helping them gain skills, start home businesses, and grow spiritually and emotionally.

MOTHERS OF CIDADE DE DEUS

16. BRAZIL

A one-year project empowering 100+ women in Rio's favelas through MomCo groups, spiritual growth, emotional healing, vocational training, and safe spaces.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

The MomCo ministry in Cidade de Deus, Brazil, expanded its reach and strengthened its care for vulnerable mothers through renovated gathering spaces, counseling support, community events, and ongoing biblical mentorship.

Today, two active MomCo groups provide consistent community and care for local mothers and families, creating a welcoming place where women can find encouragement, emotional support, and the reminder that they are seen, valued, and loved by God.

SCHOOL CONNECTION

ARGENTINA

Aims to bring MomCo to 10 schools in Merlo and Santa Rosa, supporting struggling families with essential needs, school supplies, tutoring, and access to health services.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

The School Connection project strengthened rural school communities across Argentina by meeting practical needs while creating opportunities for mothers to experience belonging, encouragement, and the love of Jesus. Across three school communities, MomCo supported vulnerable families, encouraged educators, created meaningful experiences for students, and walked alongside mothers facing difficult circumstances.

The impact is also developing new MomCo leaders and building lasting community. As one mother shared, “For the first time in my life, I have purpose and I have friends.” Through practical care and authentic relationships, moms are finding connection, renewed hope, and a place to *belong*.

HOLISTIC MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING:

HOPE FOR WOMEN IN PROSTITUTION

18.

THE GAMBIA

Uplifts women in prostitution in The Gambia through mental health support, life skills training, and faith-based community, helping them heal, build resilience, and reclaim their lives.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through this project, MomCo leaders reached more than 25 women and children affected by prostitution through outreach, workshops, prayer, Bible teaching, and practical skills development. The project created opportunities for women to experience dignity, encouragement, and support while building pathways toward a new future.

Two new MomCo groups were launched in Tanji and Farato, providing ongoing Christ-centered community where women can develop practical skills, build meaningful relationships, and experience eternal hope..



FRESH START PARTIES

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Project leaders have walked alongside five reunited families, helping them rebuild stability, strengthen relationships, and create a foundation for lasting connection. Among those families, one entire family chose to be baptized together and began regularly attending church, a powerful picture of the restoration this work seeks to make possible. The leadership team, made up of former foster youth, kinship caregivers, adoptive and foster parents, and community workers, brings both lived experience and deep compassion to this work, uniquely equipping them to provide consistent support as families heal, reconnect, and build a new future together.

CALIFORNIA

A faith-based initiative supporting mothers reunified with their children from foster care, offering celebration, mentorship, and access to practical resources to foster long-term family stability and spiritual encouragement.

HOPE HELPS

20. CALIFORNIA

Empowers extraordinary moms of children with extensive needs by providing respite, practical support, and inclusion within the MomCo community.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through Hope Helps, Venture Los Gatos MomCo reached more than 74 women, including six mothers raising children with special needs who received personalized care and practical support during challenging seasons. Through gatherings with child care and meals, respite care, therapy equipment, home organization, and thoughtful gifts, mothers experienced a community where they could feel known, supported, and valued.

The initiative also mobilized the broader MomCo community to turn compassion into action through ongoing prayer, meaningful connection, and practical resources, creating a lasting network of Christ-centered care for families navigating complex circumstances.

MAMAS ARISE

NAKABISO, UGANDA

21.

A seven-day outreach in Nakabiso, Uganda, offering vulnerable mothers medical care, counseling, spiritual support, and community through MomCo, culminating in a celebration that restores dignity and hope.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through a November medical outreach event, more than 300 mothers in Uganda received essential medical care, prayer, and Mamas Arise dignity kits. The project met tangible needs while creating opportunities for vulnerable mothers to experience compassionate care, renewed hope, and the love of Jesus.



LIGHT OF HOPE

SOUTH ASIA

22.

A one-year Christian initiative in local slums empowering mothers through awareness, counseling, and support while providing free English-medium education for their children, fostering a generation rooted in learning, love, and the gospel.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through Light of Hope, more than 133 mothers in underserved communities across South Asia are being reached with the gospel and invited into ongoing community. Following a Christmas gathering, two new groups for mothers who do not yet follow Jesus were launched, where women are continuing to engage with MomCo curriculum on topics including parenting, patience, and self-control.

A special Women's Day gathering also provided practical support to widows while encouraging mothers to put faith, goodness, and service into action within their families and communities.

TWELVE 12 MINISTRIES

23. VIRTUAL (U.S.)

Supports women facing infertility, miscarriage, or childlessness through Christ-centered care, community, and resources — such as the Butterfly Box, support groups, and online programs — offering hope and healing to those often unseen.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through Twelve 12 Ministries, 50 Butterfly Boxes were provided to women and families navigating infertility, miscarriage, pregnancy loss, and childlessness. Each box offered -encouragement, practical care, and a tangible reminder that they are seen, supported, and not alone.

The ministry also connected with three MomCo groups during Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month, creating opportunities for women to find healing, meaningful support, and Christ-centered community during some of life's most difficult seasons.



LITERACY FOR MOMS

24.

WEST AFRICA

Empowers 850 mothers in West Africa by improving literacy to enable informed decisions, spiritual growth, and community impact.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Across three Tehilah MomCo Literacy School centers, approximately 200 women were equipped with foundational reading and writing skills. Women who completed the program graduated with greater confidence and new abilities they can use in their everyday lives.

The centers also provided practical skills training, including making liquid soap and pomade, equipping women with additional tools to strengthen themselves and their families.

CREATING MORE GROUPS IN SPAIN

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

A missionary in Galicia, northwest Spain, is currently leading a MomCo group in A Coruña while prayerfully laying the groundwork for expansion across the country. She has connected with churches and leaders in Valencia, Oviedo, Algeciras, Seville, Madrid, Santiago de Compostela, and surrounding communities, receiving strong interest and positive responses. Start-up funding for registration and materials is being offered to support new leaders, with training and soft launches anticipated this spring and full group launches planned for early fall.

25.

SPAIN

Seeks to expand MomCo across Spain by supporting new groups with seed funding, fostering community for moms, meeting emotional and spiritual needs, and reaching diverse populations with the gospel.

EMPOWERING MOTHERS, STRENGTHENING COMMUNITIES

26. MALAWI

Expands programs supporting teen and vulnerable mothers with spiritual care, practical resources, life skills training, and mentorship, empowering at least 120 mothers to thrive and positively impact their communities.

ONE-YEAR UPDATE:

Through the Pitch Night project in Mzuzu, Malawi North, approximately 175 women were reached through MomCo groups, Bible studies, Village Savings and Loans, and practical support. Three new MomCo groups were launched, creating ongoing opportunities for connection and spiritual growth.

Single women and teen mothers also learned sewing skills and participated in MomCo curriculum, while 45 vulnerable teen mothers received food, soap, encouragement, and the opportunity to hear the hope of Jesus.
