MOMCO MISSION

MomCo encourages and equips moms of young children to realize their potential as mothers, women and leaders, in relationship with Jesus and in partnership with the local church.

BETTER MOMS. BETTER WORLD.

Moms are some of the most powerful influencers on the planet. They are shaping hearts before anyone else ever has the chance. They are the first teachers, the first comforters, the first voices speaking truth into the next generation. When a mom is strengthened in her faith, her children do not just benefit for a season. They experience lifelong flourishing through the opportunity to know Jesus.

When you invest in a mom, you are not making a small decision. You are changing families. You are reaching communities. You are influencing nations. You are advancing the Kingdom.

Each year, MomCo stewards every dollar prayerfully, asking the Lord where resources can create the greatest Gospel impact. In recent years, it became clear that He was inviting us to do something bold — to place resources directly into the hands of the women who are catalyzing change at the grassroots level: our MomCo moms.

That invitation led to Pitch Night.

Launched in spring 2024, Pitch Night opened the door for MomCo leaders around the world to submit proposals for projects designed to equip moms, strengthen local communities, and introduce more families to Jesus. The inaugural year confirmed what we believed all along. When you trust women who are already faithfully leading where they live, transformation follows.

In its second year, the response was overwhelming. We received 103 proposals from across the globe, 66 from international leaders and 37 from the United States. Behind every submission was a mom who saw a need, carried a burden, and believed God could use her to meet it.

From those proposals, 26 projects were selected for funding in 2026. Grants were awarded at \$10,000, \$8,000, \$5,000 and \$2,500 levels, allowing more women to step forward and bring their God-given visions to life. In total, \$150,000 was invested to equip and empower moms serving families and communities around the world.

That investment was made possible by you.

In these pages, you will meet the women you have empowered. You will see the courage, creativity and faith your generosity has unlocked. And you will witness what happens when faithful partners choose to believe that moms are worth investing in.

Because they are.

And because of you, lives are being changed.

COME AS YOU ARE:

ESTABLISHING A FAITHFUL WELCOME FOR
NEURODIVERGENT FAMILIES

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Between November 2025 and January 2026, Come As You Are moved from vision to visible transformation. What began as one mom's conviction that neurodivergent children deserve to be fully welcomed in faith spaces has become a model for meaningful inclusion.

With support from Pitch Night, Trinity Lutheran Church and School and Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church and School reimagined how they serve neurodivergent children and their families. Long standing barriers to participation were replaced with intentional design, practical tools and shared understanding among educators and clergy.

Many faith communities are not equipped to support neurodivergent children. Parents often feel isolated and discouraged as they search for churches and schools where their children are embraced, not merely accommodated. Come As You Are exists to change that reality.

Through this grant, both campuses launched neurodiversity training for educators, volunteers and church staff. Sensory friendly environments were thoughtfully assessed and redesigned. Resource kits were developed to foster understanding and inclusion across classrooms and worship settings.

Today, both communities have updated sensory rooms, portable sensory supports available during Mass, and eleven fully equipped early childhood classroom toolkits. These physical improvements were strengthened through hands-on training and written guides to ensure long-term sustainability.

These are not cosmetic upgrades. They represent cultural change. Neurodivergent children are now better able to engage in worship and learning. Families report feeling seen and supported rather than judged. Staff members feel confident serving children with diverse sensory needs. Both schools are positioned to carry inclusive practices forward well beyond the life of the grant.

IMPACT: *Through this initiative, upwards of 150 women have been reached through school and church engagement, and more than 300 children are served through weekend Masses. Ninety children regularly attend Trinity services, and 11 early childhood classrooms are now equipped with sensory tools that make participation possible.*

01.

ILLINOIS

Many faith communities and parochial schools are not equipped to support neurodivergent children and their families. Parents often feel isolated, misunderstood and heartbroken as they search for spaces where their children are welcomed and their unique needs are met with compassion.

The Come As You Are initiative, led by a MomCo leader with firsthand experience, aims to change that. This project aims to partner with churches and parochial schools to build environments where every child is embraced as a gift from God.

With MomCo's support, this initiative will launch neurodiversity trainings for educators, volunteers and church staff. It will create sensory-friendly spaces in both schools and churches and develop resource kits that foster understanding and inclusion. The goal is to equip faith communities to love and support neurodivergent children and their families with grace, not judgment.

This project is rooted in the belief that no mom should have to choose between her child and her faith community, and no child should feel like a disruption in the house of God. Through practical tools and a spirit of inclusivity, this work will open doors for families who have historically felt unwelcome in faith spaces.

HOPE FOR MOMS

02.

SOUTH ASIA

In the slums of South Asia, more than 1.5 million people live in overcrowded conditions with limited access to clean water, sanitation and health care. Pregnant and nursing mothers are especially vulnerable, often facing malnutrition, long working hours and little to no support. Many are domestic workers or laborers, balancing survival with the demands of motherhood. Their children are frequently left unattended and exposed to unsafe environments.

MomCo is already present in the heart of this reality, serving 30 moms living in the slums. The Hope for Moms project will build on that foundation to reach 500 more women with tangible support and spiritual care. With the help of current MomCo members, the project will form 20 new groups of 25 moms each, creating safe spaces for community, discipleship and growth.

Moms will receive counseling, skills training, child care support, and self-care resources to help them identify their strengths and gain confidence. The MomCo Global Curriculum will guide their spiritual journey, encouraging women to love God with their whole heart, mind and body. Emotional health will be addressed using the Global Mental Health Curriculum, and leaders will share personal testimonies to stir faith and offer hope. Moms who choose to follow Jesus will be connected with local churches, and their children will be ministered to through the KidsCo program.

The project will culminate in a celebration for the moms served and their children. With a sustainable, peer-led model and support from community partners, this work will continue long after the initial grant, offering ongoing hope and transformation for mothers living in South Asia's most vulnerable communities.



MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Hope for Moms in South Asia is already bearing visible fruit through a growing and diverse network of community groups reaching women who are often overlooked and underserved.

Led by a team of 10 trained leaders, the project is currently engaging 30 to 60 mothers across six MomCo groups established within slum communities. Among them is one group made up entirely of Muslim women, one entirely of Hindu women, and several mixed groups of believers and nonbelievers. This diversity is not incidental. It reflects the trust being built and the quiet unity forming across cultural and faith lines.

Through the MomCo Global Curriculum, mothers have participated in meaningful sessions focused on joy and family health, gaining practical tools to strengthen emotional resilience and nurture healthier homes. Spiritual encouragement and relational support are paired with tangible care. The distribution of food packets has met urgent physical needs while reinforcing the message that these women are seen and deeply valued.

Together, these efforts are creating safe spaces where mothers experience dignity, connection and hope. What began as a vision is becoming a steady presence in communities where support for women is scarce and transformation is long overdue.

IMPACT: *The project currently supports six active groups serving 30 to 60 mothers, with new women continuing to join as trust deepens within the community.*

(MATERNITY BRINGS MOVEMENT CLOSER TO AGREEMENT)

03. DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

In the Dominican Republic, thousands of Haitians are being deported each day. Among them are mothers, some just days postpartum, crossing into unfamiliar territory with infants in their arms and no support system in place. One such woman was a MomCo leader, forced to leave her home shortly after giving birth. Her story represents the harsh reality many Haitian mothers face.

Amid this crisis, Dominican MomCo leaders are seeking to break down cultural barriers and extend love and solidarity to their Haitian sisters. The M.A.M.A. program was created to foster unity and healing between Dominican and Haitian moms through the shared experience of motherhood.

This project will begin with leaders from both communities, pairing Haitian and Dominican MomCo groups to support expectant mothers. Together they will host joint gatherings, organize baby showers, and provide resources translated into Creole to ensure Haitian mothers feel seen, included and cared for.

Through these relationships, moms will discover that even though they have different languages, cultures and circumstances, they share the same calling. This project aims to lift the banner of love and unity within the body of Christ and show that motherhood is a bond strong enough to bridge even the deepest divides.



MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Project M.A.M.A. has reached its halfway point with clear evidence of God at work among mothers and children in the Dominican Republic.

Over the past quarter, new doors opened for leadership development and compassionate outreach. The project has equipped 15 MomCo group coordinators, supported 13 pregnant mothers, and served more than 60 women through baby showers and ministry gatherings. These events provided essential care items for mothers and babies, but even more importantly, they created Christ-centered spaces where Dominican and Haitian women could gather, build trust and experience dignity. In communities shaped by immigration pressures and family separation, being seen and valued is no small thing.

The impact extended powerfully to children as well. Christmas and Three Kings Day celebrations reached more than 180 children and over 120 mothers, offering moments of joy, prayer and shared celebration. In the midst of hardship, families encountered the hope of Christ in tangible and relational ways.

In addition, the launch of Creole language social media resources has expanded encouragement and biblical truth to Haitian mothers both in the Dominican Republic and in Haiti, increasing access and deepening connection.

At this midpoint, project M.A.M.A. reflects the heart of Christ by strengthening leaders, caring for the vulnerable, and building a foundation of faith and unity that will shape families for years to come.

IMPACT: *To date, project M.A.M.A. has directly impacted more than 190 mothers, including 15 group coordinators and 13 pregnant women, through leadership training, baby showers and community gatherings. It has also reached over 190 children through seasonal celebrations that delivered care, joy and Christ-centered hope to families navigating significant hardship.*

MIAHY MEANS CARE

04. MADAGASCAR

In Madagascar, nearly one third of girls become mothers between the ages of 15 and 19, often due to unplanned pregnancy and a lack of education. Once pregnant, these young women are excluded from the national scholarship system and face significant barriers to continuing their studies, finding employment or being accepted into marriage. Many rely on handouts to survive and experience mental health challenges rooted in shame, isolation and poverty.

Located in one of the most remote regions of southern Madagascar, MomCo Farafangana serves 50 local moms, 80% of whom became mothers as teenagers. The MIAHY project seeks to reach them, along with 100 additional young mothers in a nearby community, with support that is both practical and deeply transformative.

The initiative will offer counseling, skills training and creative activities that help each woman identify and develop her gifts, paving a path toward emotional healing and financial independence. To care for their spiritual needs, the MomCo leaders will present a drama based on the story in 1 Kings 3 that explores wisdom and dignity in motherhood. The project will culminate with a celebration day for the moms and their children.

By investing in these young women, MomCo and the MIAHY project are giving women the resources to restore their sense of worth, build a foundation for a better future, and experience the hope found in Jesus.



MID-YEAR UPDATE:

The MomCo MIAHY project is making steady and meaningful progress in supporting teen mothers across the communities of Farafangana and Vangaindrano.

This initiative has intentionally engaged young women who gave birth at an early age, many of whom carry stigma, isolation and limited opportunity. Through consistent spiritual encouragement, mental health training and authentic community connection, these mothers are beginning to experience renewed confidence and belonging.

Bible distribution and guided Scripture engagement have provided regular access to God's Word, strengthened by partnerships with local churches committed to sustaining each woman's faith journey beyond the life of the grant. Alongside spiritual and emotional support, the project has delivered practical assistance through the distribution of gifts and essential items for mothers and their children, meeting urgent needs ahead of the Christmas season.

Personal testimonies reflect visible transformation in self-worth, family relationships and hope for the future. While skills training and a culminating celebration are scheduled for the coming months, plans are already underway to expand outreach into an additional town, extending the project's long-term impact and ensuring more young mothers are reached.

IMPACT: *Leaders have connected teen mothers across three communes to the MIAHY initiative, creating consistent pathways for spiritual growth and mental health support. In October, participants received free Bibles, and 250 mothers are now registered for a six-session program designed to strengthen resilience, faith and community connection.*

PORTLAND NEEDS GOD

05. OREGON

In Portland, Oregon, raising a family can feel like swimming upstream. Public drug use, spiritual apathy, and anti-family messaging are part of the daily landscape. Churches struggle to grow, and families often feel isolated in their desire to follow Jesus and raise children with purpose. In addition, no church in Portland proper has a MomCo ministry.

Yet Portland is also a place of striking beauty, creativity and opportunity. Nestled between rivers and mountains, it is a city alive with possibility. And in the midst of its challenges, God is stirring something new.

Portland Needs God exists to encourage and equip families who are choosing to stay and stand firm in their faith, as well as families who are new to faith and are seeking community. Through launching several MomCo groups for connection, discipleship and community, this project will unite Christian moms who are raising children in one of the most spiritually challenging places in the country.

By building intentional relationships and strengthening their faith, these moms will become a source of light and hope in a city that desperately needs both.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

In October, project leader and ministry partner Rachelle Lazenby unexpectedly passed away. Her leadership had shaped a growing community of mothers across Portland, and her loss was deeply felt.

In the midst of grief, the community chose to gather.

Within weeks, 30 mothers and 30 children representing more than 10 churches attended their first MomCo Meetup. What could have become a season of fragmentation instead became a testimony of unity. Mothers showed up for one another. Churches leaned in. The mission continued.

Today, meetups and events reflect a healthy 60-to-40 blend of returning mothers and new participants, evidence that the community is both sustaining and expanding. After Rachelle's passing, Mara stepped in to lead KidsCo, ensuring children continued to experience consistency, care and joy each month.

Even in loss, growth is unfolding.

IMPACT: *Fifty-five mothers have engaged with the group this season, with 25 to 30 attending each monthly meetup and an average of 10 new mothers joining at every gathering. Approximately 40 children rotate through KidsCo, experiencing a safe and nurturing environment while their mothers build community and faith.*



SUPPORTING OUR LOCAL MATERNITY WARD

06.

ZAMBIA



In the rural outskirts of Lusaka, Zambia, the local maternity ward is overcrowded and under-resourced. Women often arrive in active labor, carrying their own water and birthing materials, and share beds due to a shortage of space, staff and supplies. While it is safer than giving birth at home, the conditions remain far from adequate.

Since 2017, MomCo Zambia has partnered with this ward, offering practical help and spiritual care. What began as a shared service project among local MomCo groups has led to tangible improvements in maternal and neonatal health, as well as stronger community support. Over the years, volunteers have returned regularly, delivering washable pads, test kits, cleaning supplies and prayerful encouragement to the women giving birth.

Now, with 60 MomCo groups across the country, the Supporting Our Local Maternity Ward initiative is proposing a two-part project to deepen their impact. First, they will provide the maternity ward with essential medical equipment, including delivery beds and heart rate monitors, to improve care for mothers and babies. Second, they will assemble 500 care packages filled with Bible verses, MomCo information, and encouraging materials to minister to each new mother. Posters with uplifting messages and invitations to join MomCo will also be displayed throughout the ward.

This project aims not only to meet urgent physical needs but also to invite more women into the hope and community of MomCo, supporting the continued growth of the movement in Zambia.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

MomCo Zambia has made significant progress this year in strengthening maternal and newborn care while expanding community-based support for mothers.

At Chipata Level One Hospital, the team partnered closely with maternity ward staff to assess critical needs and guide meaningful development within the ward. Through this collaboration, essential medical equipment was purchased, including a Resuscitaire machine, CPAP machine, cardiography monitors, patient monitors and specialized lighting. These additions have significantly increased the hospital's capacity to support safe deliveries and provide lifesaving care for vulnerable newborns in the NICU and neonatal units.

Beyond clinical investment, MomCo Zambia has prioritized dignified, practical support for mothers. MomCo-branded care bags are now being distributed to women delivering at the hospital, filled with feeding bottles, nappies, informational flyers and drinks that support breast milk production. Following insights gained during a mission hospital visit, washable maternity pads were also added to promote sustainability and dignity in recovery.

The ministry's impact extends beyond hospital walls. Six new MomCo groups have launched in Kalomo, Southern Province, creating consistent spaces of encouragement, spiritual growth and relational support for mothers within their local communities.

Together, these efforts represent a holistic approach that integrates medical advancement, practical care and community building to improve outcomes for mothers and families across Zambia.

IMPACT: *The donation of six essential pieces of maternity and neonatal equipment is strengthening care, and countless mothers and newborns at Chipata Level One Hospital, expanding the hospital's ability to respond to critical needs during delivery and early infancy. At the same time, six newly launched MomCo groups are establishing sustainable support systems for mothers and children within their communities, ensuring that care continues long after hospital discharge.*

MUMCO ON THE ROAD

07.

AUSTRALIA

Through a 10-day outreach trip, MumCo on the Road will bring the MumCo experience to five Australian regions to support local mums, share the hope of Jesus, and inspire churches to start their own MumCo Meetups.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

The Australian MumCo team is preparing for its first national road trip, scheduled for March 22 to 29, 2026. During this week, leaders will meet with churches across Australia to cast vision, build relationships and help launch new MomCo groups. Outreach to churches is already underway, and the team is prayerfully preparing for meaningful connections that will expand support for mothers across the country.

\$5,000 WINNERS

MOMCO BUS

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Despite rapid growth (41 new MomCo groups in one year), expansion is hindered by a lack of transportation in Ghana. Many moms are unable to participate in community gatherings simply because they have no way to travel. This dedicated bus will enable 1,500 moms to attend annual events and empower local leaders to reach new regions, train volunteers, and launch additional groups across the country. To maximize the use of funds, MomCo moms purchased a bus in Togo and are currently awaiting its release so it can be transported to Ghana to begin serving moms across the region.

08.

GHANA

Using a bus, MomCo Ghana will transport over 1500 moms to MomCo conferences, furthering the reach of MomCo from nine to all sixteen regions in Ghana.

LOVED, SEEN, INCLUDED

09.

BRAZIL

Loved, Seen, Included equips 10 Brazilian churches to support moms of children with disabilities through training, resources and MomCo groups, fostering inclusive communities where mothers feel seen, cared for and connected to Jesus.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Project leaders have visited five of the ten churches on their itinerary, equipping each congregation to launch ministries that support people with disabilities while establishing new MomCo groups. As a result, five groups are now active and already hosting monthly gatherings for mothers of children with disabilities. To further strengthen these efforts, 50 practical handbooks have been printed and distributed, providing pastors and church leaders with clear guidance for building more inclusive and welcoming church communities.

CLEAN HOPE

10.

CENTRAL ASIA

Through an affordable, faith-centered laundromat, mothers have a safe place to wash clothes, rest and connect through MomCo events while having the opportunity to work and gain a community.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Renovations have begun on the newly purchased space that will provide laundry services, employment opportunities, and a safe communal gathering place in an area with limited economic resources. The rooms have been cleared and freshly painted, laying the groundwork for what is to come. Next steps include installing the laundry units and launching MomCo groups, transforming this space into both a practical support center and a hub of connection for local mothers.

HOPE THROUGH MOTHERS

BREAKING CHAINS OF ADDICTION WITH MOMCO

11.

SOUTH ASIA

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Project leaders are actively serving more than 100 mothers navigating addiction, providing structured support and consistent community. After a brief pause following the project leader's new addition to her family, the work resumed in January 2026 and remains on track for completion in July.

The Hope Through Mothers initiative supports mothers affected by family addiction through Christ-centered healing, counseling and community, helping them find hope, purpose and faith in Jesus.

HIGH-EFFICIENCY STOVES & NEW MOMCO GROUPS FOR EASTERN UGANDA

12.

UGANDA

This project distributes 1,024 efficient, safe cooking stoves to mothers in Eastern Uganda, reducing fuel use, smoke and daily hardship, while launching 20 new MomCo groups to provide practical, emotional and spiritual support.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Before distributing stoves, 50 mothers began participating in MomCo training to establish a foundation rooted in leadership and community rather than charity alone. Beginning in March, these women will identify needs within their neighborhoods and lead stove distribution to other mothers, extending both practical support and relational connection.



HOPE FOR HER

13.

UGANDA

A cervical cancer awareness and screening initiative, Hope for Her provides 600 women with education, free testing and spiritual support, empowering them to take control of their health while connecting them to MomCo community support.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

In February, leaders hosted a three-day cervical cancer awareness medical camp, providing critical screenings for women, deworming treatment for children, and Tetanus vaccinations for young girls. The camp addressed urgent health needs while reinforcing MomCo's commitment to holistic care for families.



THE LIGHT PROJECT

14.

MINNESOTA

The Light Project is an outreach that brings hope to local mothers through Hope Boxes, Haven Helpers and Grace Grams, which offer tangible support, encouragement and reminders of God's love to those who feel unseen or alone.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Since the project began, 150 parents and 63 children have received gift boxes that carried both practical support and the hope of Jesus during difficult seasons. Additional funds made possible a Christmas celebration for 23 families, complete with cookie decorating and craft stations designed to help families celebrate Jesus and experience joy together during the holidays.

BAKING MOMS COLLECTIVE

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

The project is currently in its third cohort, supporting single mothers raising children with disabilities through practical skills training and emotional support, including hands-on classes like cake making. With 25 mothers already trained, a new cohort of 10 starting February 6, and a goal of reaching 60 mothers overall, the project continues to build skills, confidence and income opportunities.

15.

CENTRAL ASIA

Empowering 60 vulnerable mothers through baking training, mentorship and faith-based support, this project equips them to gain skills, start home businesses, and grow spiritually and emotionally.

MOTHERS OF CIDADE DE DEUS

16.

BRAZIL

A one-year project, Mothers of Cidade de Deus empowers 100+ women in Rio’s favelas through MomCo groups, spiritual growth, emotional healing, vocational training and safe spaces.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Mothers of Cidade de Deus launched last year and now hosts monthly gatherings with approximately 30 mothers attending each meeting. While some women participate consistently, others face ongoing barriers shaped by poverty and drug-related challenges within the community. Leaders are actively remodeling the meeting space to create a more welcoming and dignified environment for both current and future participants. In October, a local nurse led a session on self-care and breast cancer prevention, providing critical health education alongside relational support.

SCHOOL CONNECTION



17.

ARGENTINA

The School Connection initiative aims to bring MomCo to 10 schools in Merlo and Santa Rosa, supporting struggling families with essential needs, school supplies, tutoring and access to health services.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Two of the five targeted schools have now received funding and support, with one already launching a MomCo group for local mothers. Through these partnerships, project leader Eliana has also helped schools send students to their nation’s capital, strengthening relationships and opening doors to deeper community engagement for families connected to the schools.

HOLISTIC MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING:

HOPE FOR WOMEN IN PROSTITUTION

18.

THE GAMBIA

This project empowers women in prostitution in The Gambia through mental health support, life skills training and faith-based community, helping them heal, build resilience and reclaim their lives.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

After distributing fliers throughout local communities and brothels, leaders hosted their first workshop on November 25, 2025, creating space to address the challenges faced by women in prostitution and explore pathways toward restoration. A central goal was to build direct, trust-based relationships with the women most affected. More than 25 women and children attended, marking a courageous first step toward connection and long-term support.



FRESH START PARTIES



19.

CALIFORNIA

Fresh Start Parties is a faith-based initiative supporting mothers reunified with their children from foster care, offering celebration, mentorship and access to practical resources to foster long-term family stability and spiritual encouragement.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Project leaders have supported five reunited families to date, walking alongside them as they rebuild stability and connection. One entire family was recently baptized together and is now regularly attending church, a powerful reflection of restored faith and unity. The leadership team mirrors the community they serve, made up of former foster youth, kinship caregivers, adoptive and foster parents, and community workers who bring lived experience and deep compassion to this work.

HOPE HELPS

20.

CALIFORNIA

Hope Helps empowers moms of children with extensive needs by providing respite, practical support, and inclusion within the MomCo community.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

This year, the Venture Los Gatos MomCo chapter is intentionally supporting mothers raising children with disabilities and complex needs. Recently, the chapter hosted a Christmas gathering designed specifically for these moms, offering a safe space to process the emotional weight of their motherhood journeys within a compassionate community. Fellow MomCo mothers contributed thoughtful gift baskets filled with meaningful items, handwritten notes and homemade treats, reinforcing that these women are seen, supported and deeply valued.

MAMAS ARISE

21.

UGANDA

A seven-day outreach in Nakabiso, Uganda, Mamas Arise offers vulnerable mothers medical care, counseling, spiritual support and community through MomCo, culminating in a celebration that restores dignity and hope.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

A November medical outreach event provided more than 300 mothers with medical care, prayer and Mamas Arise dignity kits. Through this initiative, vulnerable women in Uganda experienced not only physical treatment but renewed hope and the message of Jesus, reflecting care for both body and spirit.

SOUTH ASIA

A one-year Christian initiative in local slums, Light of Hope empowers mothers through awareness, counseling and support while providing free English-medium education for their children, fostering a generation rooted in learning, love and the Gospel.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

More than 133 mothers in the slums of South Asia are being reached with the Gospel through counseling, compassionate care and free English-medium education for their children, helping cultivate a generation rooted in learning and faith. A Christmas gathering hosted by the project leader led to the launch of two new groups of nonbelieving mothers who are now engaging with the MomCo Curriculum. Through topics such as patience, parenting and self-control, these women are experiencing meaningful personal growth and positive change within their families.

TWELVE 12 MINISTRIES

23.

VIRTUAL (US)

Twelve 12 Ministries, inspired by Romans 12:12, supports women facing infertility, miscarriage or childlessness through Christ-centered care, community and resources — such as the Butterfly Box, support groups and online programs — offering hope and healing to those often unseen.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Through the generosity of a MomCo group in Plano, Texas, 40 care boxes have been delivered to women walking through infertility, miscarriage, pregnancy loss and childlessness. Each box is thoughtfully filled with journals, handwritten notes and prayers, offering comfort, acknowledgment and the steady reminder that no woman grieves alone.



LITERACY FOR MOMS

WEST AFRICA

The Literacy for Moms initiative empowers 850 mothers in West Africa by improving literacy to enable informed decisions, spiritual growth and community impact.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

Tehilah MomCo Literacy School is operating three centers that serve approximately 200 learners, with classes held three times each week. Consistent instruction has led to encouraging academic progress, reflected in strong exam results before the 2025 Christmas break. The program also promotes practical skill development, including soap and pomade making, and recently strengthened the learning environment through the donation of 24 desks.

CREATING MORE GROUPS IN SPAIN

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

A missionary in Galicia, northwest Spain, is currently leading a MomCo group in A Coruña while prayerfully laying the groundwork for expansion across the country. She has connected with churches and leaders in Valencia, Oviedo, Algeciras, Seville, Madrid, Santiago de Compostela and surrounding communities, receiving strong interest and positive responses. Startup funding for registration and materials is being offered to support new leaders, with training and soft launches anticipated this spring and full group launches planned for early fall.

SPAIN

This project seeks to expand MomCo across Spain by supporting new groups with seed funding, fostering community for moms, meeting emotional and spiritual needs, and reaching diverse populations with the Gospel.

EMPOWERING MOTHERS, STRENGTHENING COMMUNITIES

26.

MALAWI

Through expanding programs supporting teen and vulnerable mothers, this project meets women with spiritual care, practical resources, life skills training and mentorship, empowering at least 120 mothers to thrive and positively impact their communities.

MID-YEAR UPDATE:

The Empowering Mothers, Strengthening Communities project in Malawi North is actively transforming lives through Village Savings and Loans Associations, Bible studies, sewing initiatives, and the provision of nutritious food for teen mothers, all rooted in sharing the message of Jesus. With the support of a \$2,500 Pitch Night grant, the initiative has expanded into new areas, reached approximately 175 women, and launched three new circles. Across these communities, women, especially single teen mothers, are gaining stability, skills, and spiritual foundations that are strengthening families for the long term.
